§ 1266.02 Reporting the Findings

(a) No later than thirty (30) calendar days after approving a tentative map, or a parcel map for which a tentative map was not required, for an area located in a state responsibility area or a very high fire hazard severity zone, a legislative body of a local agency shall electronically transmit a copy of the findings required in § 1266.01 and accompanying tentative or parcel map(s) to the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection.

(b) The findings and map(s) shall be delivered in portable

document format (pdf) and submitted electronically to the Board.

(c) The Board may request additional versions of the map(s) to establish greater clarity regarding the findings. This request may ask for the maps in other file formats, such as Geographic
