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1	Subdivision: an existing development of more than thirty (30)
2	residential units, not necessarily subdivided as defined in-

6	Code 51178 and Public Resources Code 4201.

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11	<u>§ 1267.01 Fire Safety Survey</u>
12	(a) On or before July 1, 2021, and every five years thereafter,
13	the board, in consultation with the State Fire Marshal, shall
14	survey local governments, including counties, cities, and fire
15	districts, to identify existing subdivisions in SRA and LRA that
16	are located in a state responsibility area or a very high fire
17	hazard severity zone without a secondary egress route. that are
18	<u>at significant fire risk.</u>
19	(i) A secondary egress route is a road, navigable by class
20	one vehicles as defined by the Federal Highway Administration,
21	of equal construction standard to the primary road (e.g., two
22	paved roads). The secondary road does not have to be rated to
23	carry the same quantity of traffic (e.g., a two-lane paved road
24	and a one-lane paved road).
25	(ii) A secondary egress route is not a road with locked
	gates or limited access; a road that directs traffic to the same

1	outlet road as the primary road or results in a circular traffic
2	flow, to the extent practicable; or a road, regardless of
3	construction material, with less than fourteen (14) feet of
4	horizontal clearance.
5	(b) Local government officials, including elected officials,
6	fire officials, or representatives of agencies that govern land
7	use planning and subdivision design, may request the board and
8	the State Fire Marshal survey specific subdivisions in their
9	jurisdiction.

19	pursuant to § 1267.03(a) to the local government that identified
20	the subdivision and to the residents of the subdivision.
