set forth therein, the Aactivities of the Board which are categorically exempt from

<u>Division 13 of the Public Resources Code</u> and which do not require environmental documentation include:

(a) Class 4: Minor Alterations to Land. Class 4 consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry and agricultural purposes.

Such actions may include, but are not limited to, the actions under the authority of PRC § 4291, including the adoption of regulations.

(ab) Class 6: Information Collection. Class 6 consists of basic data collection, research, experimental management, and resource evaluation activities which do not result in a serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource, including but not limited to forest surveys and soil erosion studies. These may be strictly for information gathering purposes, or as part of a study leading to an action which a public agency has not yet approved, adopted, or funded.
