

## **Shared Stewardship**

- Shared Stewardship Agreement signing imminent: State of California and USFS
- 20 Master Stewardship Agreements

Forest Service

- 29 Stewardship Project Agreements
  - 15 distinct partners
  - 20 projects involve CA Climate funds

## California Climate Investment Forest Health Grants

About \$95 million dollars to Region 5 and our partners to date

- All lands, cross boundary work
- 15 distinct partner applicants
- About 75 % federal, 25 % private
- Will treat ~82,000 acres on National Forest System (13 NFs)



## **Timber Volume**

Attained 375 MMBF

- Highest Volume in 11 years
- 103% of target (364 MMBF)
- FY20 Target: 400 MMBF
- Salvage about 168 MMBF
- Green about 232 MMBF

## **Fuels Reduction**

Treated 217,000 acres total

- About 97% of target of 223,000 acres
- Lost 35 days, ~20 burn days to furlough
- Mechanical:
  171,000 acres
- Prescribed Fire:
  - 46,000 acres





## Reforestation

Accomplished 7,035 acres

- Planting: 6,969 acres
- Natural Regeneration: 66 acres

## Reforestation Need: 257,000 acres\*

- Planting about 83%
- Natural Regeneration about 17%





## **Forest Products Modernization**

Continuing our strategic efforts designed to better align our culture, policies, and procedures with current and future forest restoration needs

- Increase pace-and-scale
- Improve forest conditions
- Improve efficiency of product delivery





## **Species Conservation Planning**

- Habitat improved 185,000 acres terrestrial, 750 acres lake, 490 miles stream
- Finalized CA Spotted Owl Conservation Strategy with US Fish and Wildlife
  - Followed landmark MOU with CAL FIRE and family-owned timber companies
  - Provides conservation assurances outside of ESA
- Sierra Meadows Partnership
- Transportation Infrastructure and Watershed Resilience Partnership (National Fish and Wildlife Foundation)







## **Range Management**

### **270 Active Permits/Permittees**

- 477 Active Allotments
- 212 Vacant Allotments

Beginning in FY2020 the Region is implementing a pilot program under our Burned Area Emergency Response plans to help replace range allotment fencing and range improvements, including corrals and water developments, damaged or lost due to wildfire.

- One inactive horse



## Farm Bill Tools

- Healthy Forest Restoration Act (Insect and Disease Designations)
  - 10.7M acres, 610 watersheds, 45% of NFS lands
  - Expedited NEPA work, Doubled use of CE's
- Good Neighbor Authority
  - 3 Master Agreements; 7 Signed Project Agreements
  - New 2019 projects: CAL FIRE SPA on Stanislaus; Nevada DNR on LTBMU
  - Klamath NF timber project contract template under review by CAL FIRE HQ
  - Master GNA in progress with Caltrans

Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit 10,000-acre CE authority used twice in 2019. Healthy Forest Restoration Act Authority: used in 10 decisions (8 DM and 2 DN) DM/CE use included 11 citing Insect and Disease or Wildfire Resilience Authorities.



## Wildfire Suppression

993 fires on 115,523 acres

- Human-caused:
   674 fires, 76,009 ac
- Lightning-caused: 316 fires, 37,453 ac
- 24 Large Incidents
- 97.6% of fires stayed small

## **Fire Modernization Efforts**

- Workforce Development
  - Seasonal vs. permanent workforce
  - Incident Command Team and crew staffing level health
  - Facilities and barracks
  - Firefighter pay and compensation

#### Technological Improvements

- Military satellites
- Drones/Lidar
- Equipment and personnel tracking (Dingell Act)
- Incident Business Mgt. and Fire Agreements
  - CFAA/CFMA
  - Local fire agreements/incident cost sharing



## **Biomass and Infrastructure**

- \$900K invested in 5 wood & biomass utilization projects
- Fully engaged in state utilization activities
- Sponsored and organized a tour of mass timber facilities for 9 state officials
- Collaborate to supply biomass to facilities with BioRAM contracts and others
