MONTHLY BOARD REPORTS

Report of the Chairman, Dr. Keith Gilless

Chairman Gilless reported on the following matters:

Expressed his sympathies to all those affected by the devastation of the Woolsey and Camp Fires. He also thanked public safety personnel, fire service personnel, and all those who assisted during the wildfires and continue to help in the aftermath. He acknowledged and expressed his sympathy on the passing of former President George H.W. Bush.

Report of the Director, Ken Pimlott

Director Pimlott reported on the following matters:

Fire Statistics:

- Over 1.6 million acres burned on State Responsibility Area and Federal lands
 - Carr and Mendocino Complex Fires
 - Hirz and Delta Fires
 - Fall Fire Siege – Woolsey and Camp Fires
- Deadliest – Camp Fire (85 people)
- Most Destructive – Camp Fire (18,804 structures) 90-95% of the town of Paradise was impacted.
- Largest – Mendocino Complex (459,123 acres)

- Fire seasons are becoming longer and are requiring more effort. Conditions are becoming more extreme, with higher temperatures and lower humidity for longer periods of time.
- CAL FIRE is currently talking with the National Institute of Standards and Technology to see if they are going to evaluate the Camp Fire as a case study. CAL FIRE wants to know what they can learn from this fire.
- There is continued work on the Helicopter Procurement.

Ventura Training Center:

- 20 Participants began October 22, 2018 and they will be receiving full CAL FIRE Firefighter Basics training. When they've completed the training, they will be doing fuels treatment and community projects in Ventura County

Strategic Plan:

Forest Health:

- The Director has had discussions with Transition Team so that there is a smooth transition for the new administration.

Fuels Treatment Goals and Statistics:

- Prescribed Fire 8,904
- Fuel Reduction 2,366
- D-Space Inspections 91,296
- CAL FIRE is in the hiring process for 6 fuels crews that will be deployed across the state to do fuels treatment projects. There is a great candidate pool to choose from, with over 300 applicants. They will be led by Forestry Assistants and Fire Captains.

Closing Comments:

- Director Pimlott announced that the December Board of Forestry meeting would be his last report to the Board. He will retire on December 31, 2018. He gave a brief history of

his work with the Department and the Board. He thanked the Board members for their commitment and service to the State of California.

Board members expressed their gratitude and well wishes to Director Pimlott and presented him with a plaque for his leadership and service.

Report of Executive Officer, Matt Dias:

Executive Officer Dias reported on the following matters:

- Briefly shared a story regarding Board Staff's plans to spread the holiday spirit by handing out care packages to the less fortunate in the downtown area. He acknowledged and thanked the individuals who thoughtfully hand knitted 300 hats to contribute to the Board staff's endeavors.


