Several organizational and phrasing changes were suggested by the Committee such as including that agencies are required to notify the Committee of changes to projects and programs related to rangeland resources and the inclusion of RMAC's interaction with federal and local government in addition to state government. Member Watson also discussed the issue of grazing as a fuels management tool and how the Strategic Plan and Mission Statement address that key component of RMAC's mission moving forward.

Discussion of 2020 Priorities

The Committee discussed the differences between the current draft of 2020 Priorities and the previously approved Priorities from 2019. The Committee also discussed RMAC's role with the CRM program and how RMAC might engage with this program in the future. The Committee decided to focus on plan development guidance in collaboration with Cal Pac SRM. Several members also expressed that issues of fire prevention should be more fully incorporated into the priorities. The Committee made some additional organizational changes and transferred one item from the 2019 priorities regarding supporting grazing on the Demonstration State Forests to the new priorities document. The Committee instructed staff to incorporate these changes and appointed a subcommittee of two (Member Soares and Chair Horney) to work with staff on a draft for the March meeting.

Status of Fuels Management by Grazing Projects

Staff shared that Kevin Conway has been working with state contracts to move forward on the State Demonstration Forest projects and is currently waiting for the contracting process to be complete.

Updates from Partner Organizations & Public Forum

Bob Gillaspy, NRCS shared that he has noticed some news headlines related to fuel reduction grazing and he is concerned about some incorrect terminology referring to grazing as "eliminating" wildfire.
