Webinar

If a quorum is present at a single location, the physical meetings may continue if the webinar broadcast is interrupted or terminated for any reason.

The Bagley-Keene Open Meetings Act only guarantees the right to offer public comment for individuals attending at a noticed location. However, the committee typically attempts to accommodate public comment from individuals observing via webcast from unnoticed locations, as described below. As stated on the Meeting Agenda, Board staff will address webcast participants prior to normal Committee business to provide guidance on meeting format and stakeholder participation.

Submitting A Comment: During the meeting, all participants will be muted by the meeting organizer. Participants will have an option to submit a comment, either by writing your comment or by directly addressing the members verbally.
